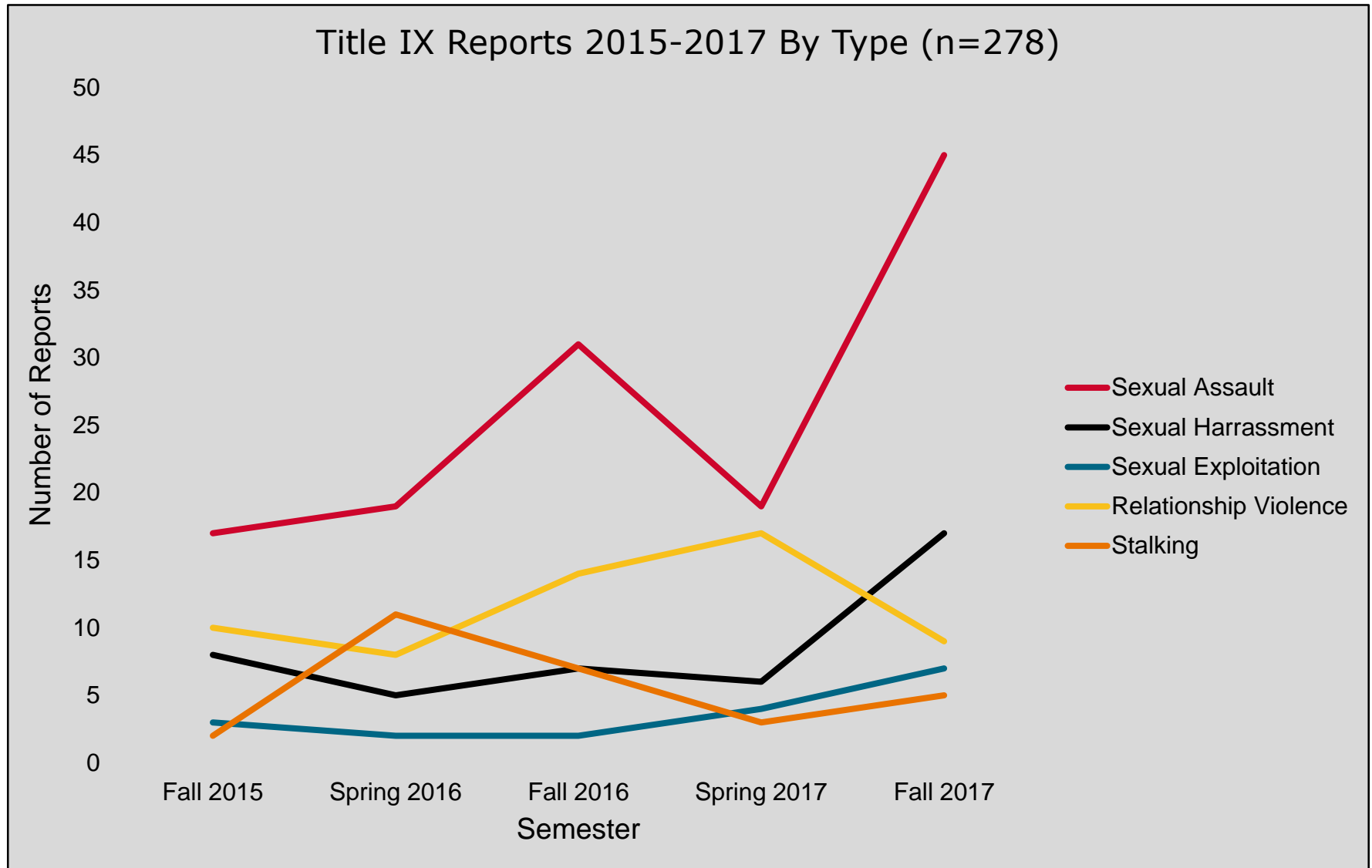

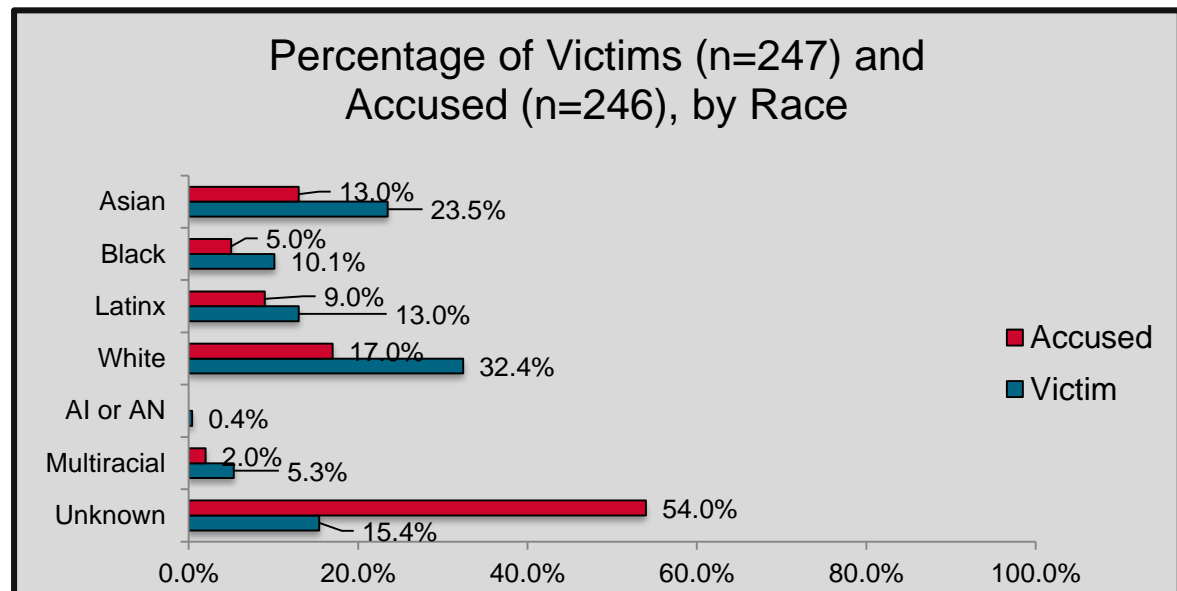

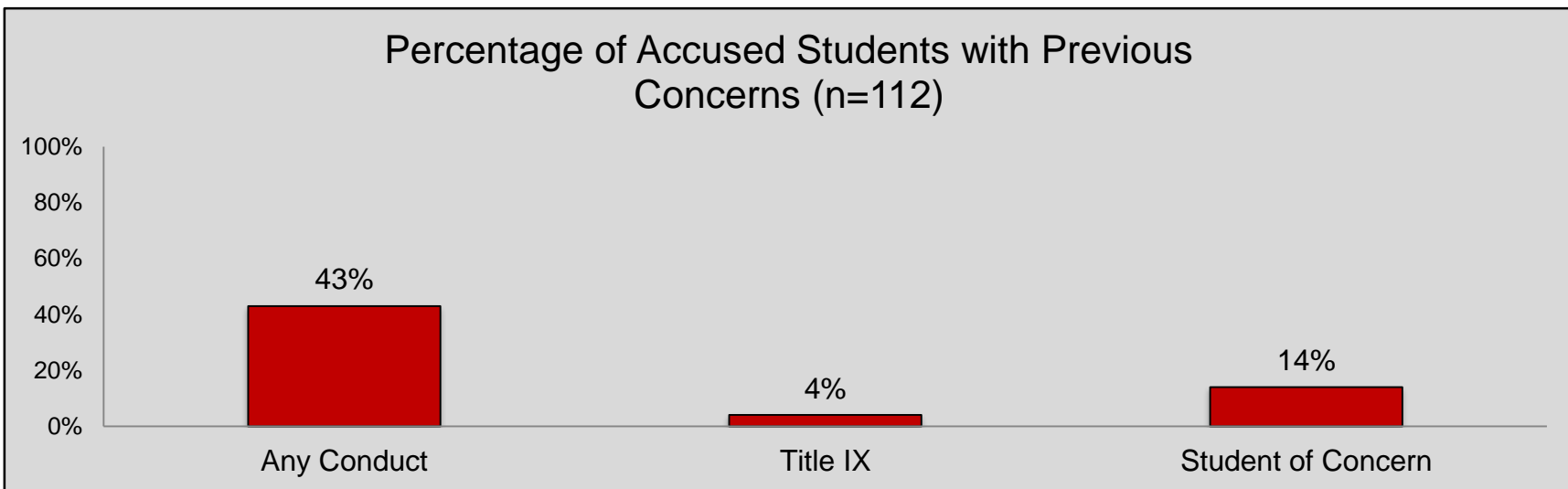

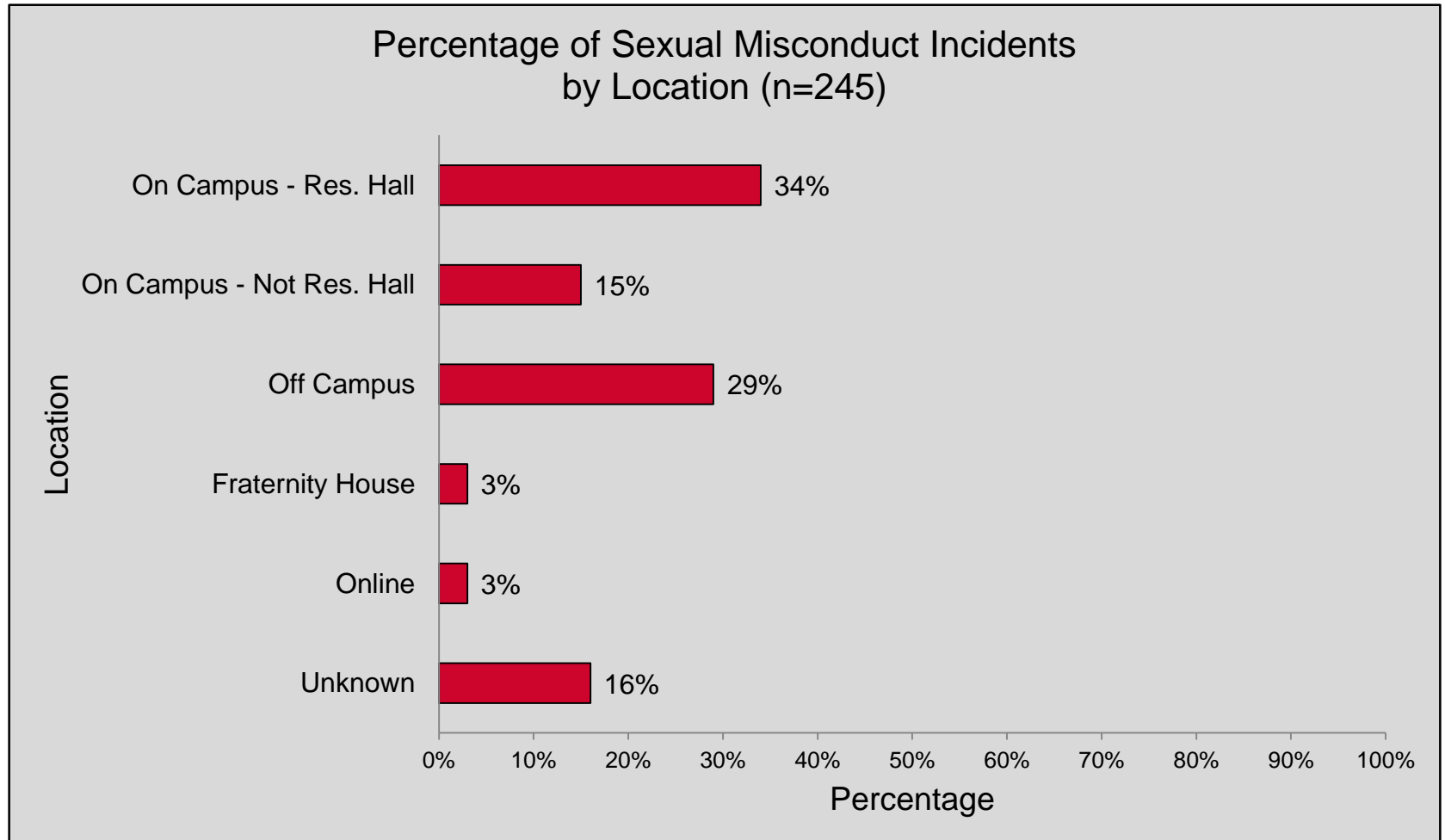

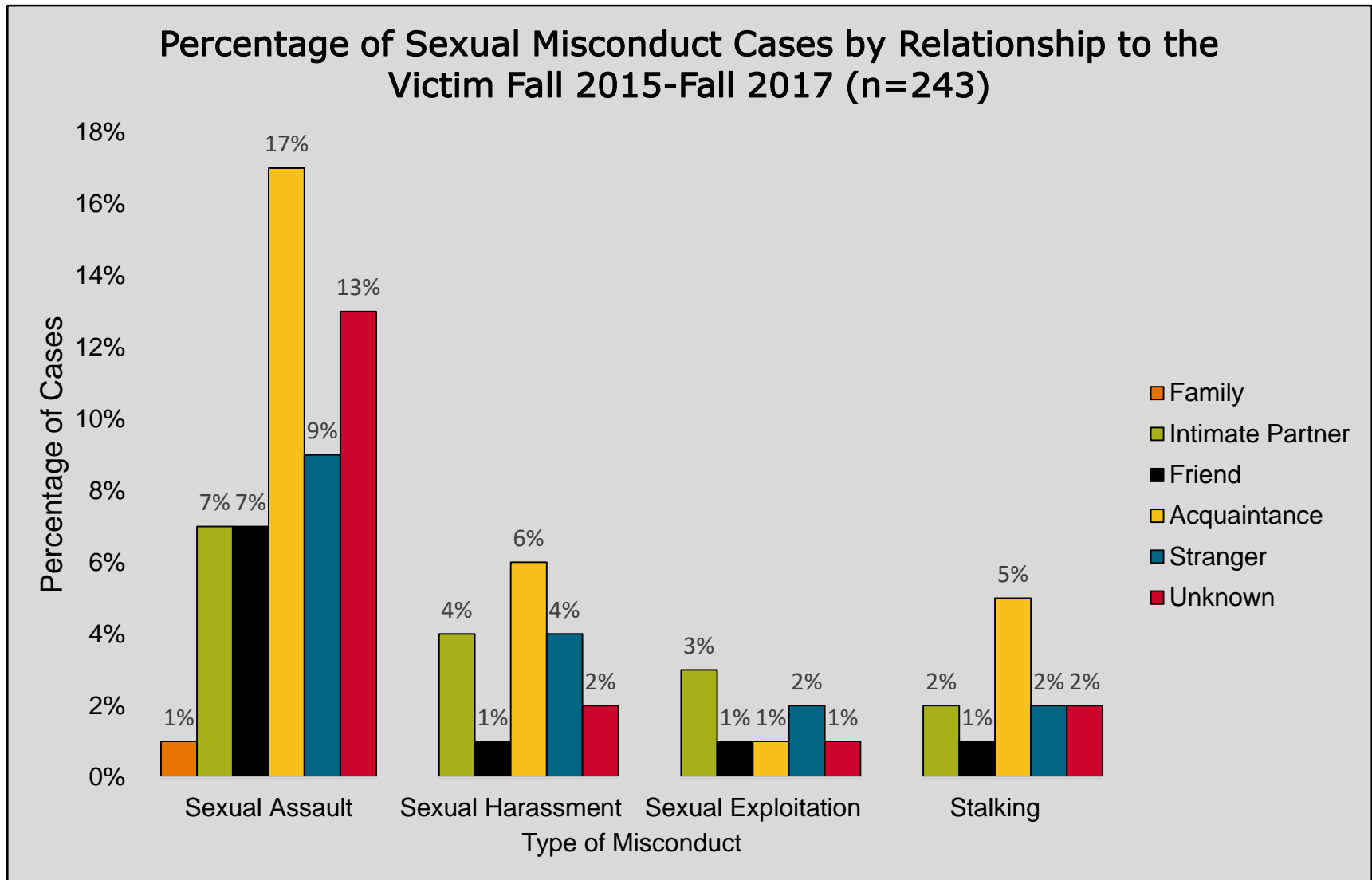

Location

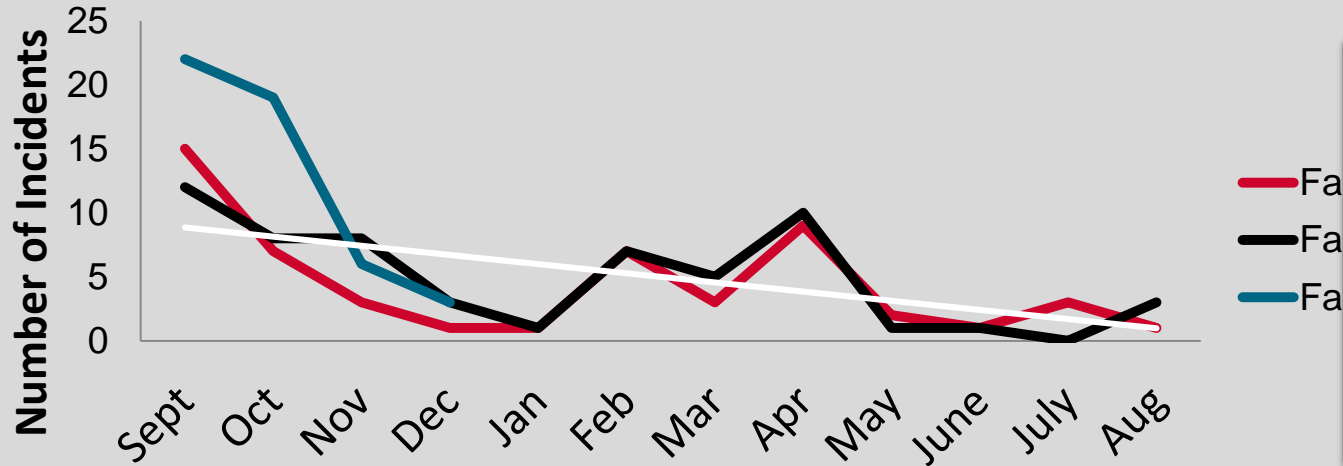


Relationships of the Victims & Accused

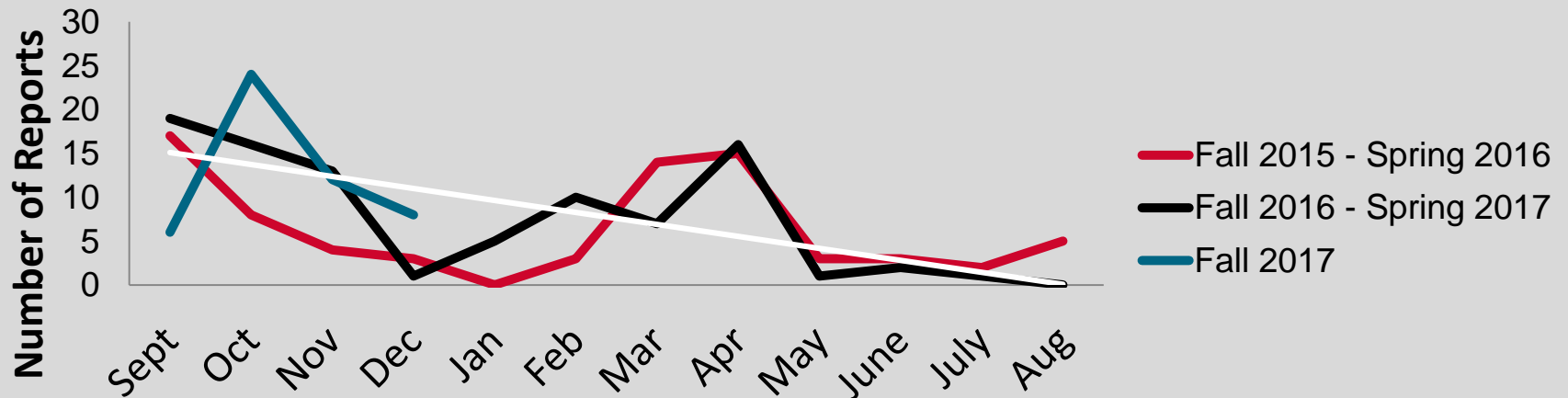
Monthly Comparison of When Incidents Occurred 2016-2018

Monthly Comparison of When Incidents Were Reported 2016-2018

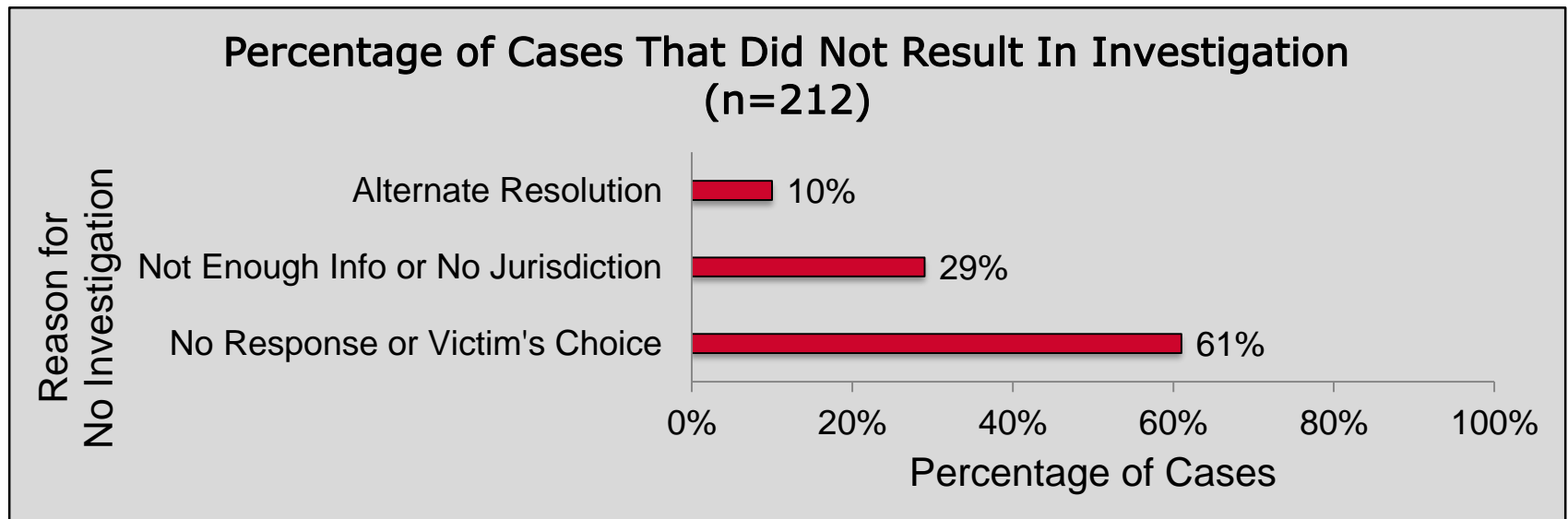


Incident Occurring vs. Reporting

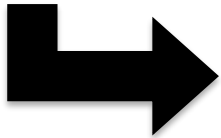

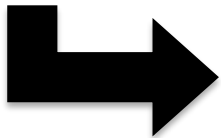
Literature Review

More reports = more awareness



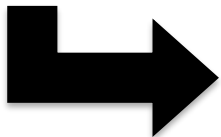
“An increase in reports for sexual violence means that college campuses are ‘breaking that culture of silence.’ (Kingkade, 2014)

Options for informal resolution = more reports



“Many student activists have become disillusioned with an emphasis on punitive justice...we’ve seen firsthand how rarely it works for survivors...it’s time to reimagine how we punish sex crimes.” (Karasek, 2018)

Campus commitment is key



“Campus Title IX officers said “their colleges would remain committed to sexual-assault prevention and response, despite the federal government’s announcement.” (Brown, 2017)
